PRE-DENTISTRY

Dentists treat the diseases and conditions that affect the mouth, jaws, teeth, and their supporting tissues. The University of Winnipeg is an excellent place to fulfill the entrance requirements for Dentistry at the University of Manitoba or other dentistry programs.

YOUR EDUCATION

Year 1-2: Pre-Dentistry at The University of Winnipeg

- x Each dentistry program has its own entrance requirements. You must consult with the school where you plan to complete your studies to ensure you choose an appropriate set of courses, and that you will meet the entrance requirements for your Dentistry program of choice.
- x To meet the entrance requirements for Dentistry at the University of Manitoba, you will complete a minimum of 60 credit hours, including the “Pre-Professional Requirements” listed below. Applicants must present two sets of two consecutive terms (September-April) with 24 credit hours of new and graded course work completed in each set. All science courses require Lab components.

- x Enrolment in dentistry programs is required. Admission to dentistry is based on the DAT, Test (DAT), and a personal interview.
- x At least four more years of study are required.

YOU SHOULD ALSO KNOW ...

Preparing for the Dental Aptitude Test (DAT) : The DAT is a standardized test that must be taken prior to December 1 of the year preceding admission. The test covers the areas of manual dexterity, natural sciences, general chemistry, perceptual ability, and reading comprehension. You may find it helpful to take a preparatory course offered by a private company, or you may choose to prepare on your own or in a study group.
